Keynote Speaker

Rhonda Blackburn, Ph.D.

B&B Consulting VP and Chief Academic Officer for LoudCloud Systems

Dr. Rhonda Blackburn has been working in academia for the pasts 20+ years as a teacher, administrator, trainer, and consultant. Now she takes that experience and applies that knowledge to make her clients successful in their eLearning goals and initiatives. As the VP and Chief Academic Officer, she helps clients create competency based programs that allow the students to track their learning and move through a curriculum at a pace that meets the students'



needs and learning experiences and enhance on-ground and online courses through the use of technology and learning outcomes assessment. She is also focused on developing a strong learning community and making sure all clients are positioned to be successful in their implementation and use of LoudCloud technology.

Prior to LoudCloud, Dr. Blackburn was the Associate Provost of Educational Enhancement at the University of Texas at Dallas. Her office covered faculty development, instructional technology, distance education, media/video services, and classroom experience. Within this capacity, she supported faculty on helping them develop well designed courses, both traditional and online. She also guided her staff in understanding technology and how it can be used effectively in a classroom setting. She spearheaded the redesign and integration of technology into the classrooms throughout the campus. Through research on the classroom experience, she was able to show how faculty development, the right technology and classroom materials, could improve student retention and learning. She conducted workshops, departmental trainings, and one-on-one consultations with faculty and support staff across campus and developed a Teaching Academy Certification, which helped faculty and teaching assistance understand the art of teaching.

Dr. Blackburn currently teaches a graduate online course at UMUC and an undergraduate hybrid course at UT Dallas. In addition to these courses, she has taught additional graduate, undergraduate, community college, continuing education, and high school courses since 1989 in face-to-face, hybrid, and online modalities. In all of her courses she utilizes technology to enhance the learning experience for the students.

Dr. Blackburn received her Ph.D. in Educational Psychology from Texas A&M University. She is also actively involved with numerous associations focused on lifelong learning including TxDLA as past-president, USDLA as an advisory board member, and NUTN as a board member.

Candace Hastings, Ph.D.

Associate Director, University Writing Center Texas A&M University

Dr. Candace Hastings is Associate Director of the Texas A&M University Writing Center, an academic support unit that provides writing and speaking tutorial




assistance to undergraduate and graduate students via F2F and web conferencing appointments as well as online submissions. Of the approximately 11,000 appointments conducted in 2015-2016 at the writing center, 4000 were conducted online or via web conferencing. Hastings is responsible for daily operations, hiring and training over 50 writing and speaking tutors, and supporting all elearning technologies and innovations at the University Writing Center.

Prior to working at the writing center, Candace was the assistant director of Instructional Technology Services at Texas A&M and maintained operations of Blackboard LMS. Before she began life as an Aggie, as Candace Schaefer she served as the dean of distance education at Blinn College. At Blinn, she developed the distance program from the ground up.

She is, by her own admission, a reluctant administrator, however. Her true passion is teaching. She taught undergraduate English composition and creative writing for twenty years at community colleges in both wired and unwired environments and is the co-author of the *Creative Writing Guide*, published by Longman. Candace is currently a visiting lecturer at Texas A&M University in the department of Educational Administration & Human Resource Development, where she teaches College Teaching and Literature Review in the graduate program. Her research interests include writing centers, academic integrity, elearning and faculty development.

In Our Memories... Anson Godfrey and Dan Jones

The membership of the Northeast Texas Consortium lost two good friends over the past year who we would like to remember – Anson Godfrey, who was our Chief Technologist, and Dan Jones, who was serving as the immediate Past Chair of our Board of Directors.



Anson joined the NETnet staff as its Chief Technologist a little over three years ago but served for many years on the NETnet Operations Advisory Group as the CIO of Texas A&M Texarkana. Anson played key roles at NETnet in the Telepsychiatry projects with Palestine Regional Medical Center, Good Shepherd Medical Center, and UT Health Northeast and in the planning for our long range fiber optic project with both our college and medical members.

Anson continued to teach online courses to the education majors at A&M Texarkana well into six month battle with cancer. He was also known by many for his off-duty activities with Rotary International. Anson served as the Northeast Texas 2014/15 District Governor and took a key role in their international projects to fight the continuing plague of polio in third world countries.

Dan Jones, as President of Texas A&M Commerce, served as Chair of the Consortium's Board of Directors from 2012 until 2014. In his NETnet role, Dr. Jones initiated the Consortium's long range fiber optic planning and championed the addition of new colleges into the group.

Matching the mission of NETnet, Dan Jones' broader career focused on increasing access to higher education and supporting the success of students. He championed initiatives, including open-educational resources, to lower textbook costs for students and was recognized by the Governor for the college's work in competency-based education. His tenure at Commerce saw the University exceed 12,000 students.

Originally a member of an English faculty, he continued to pursue interests in non-fiction writing and regularly spoke to both regional and national conferences. "Dr. Jones believed in the power of

education to transform lives and shape futures, and dedicated his career to expanding opportunity for all students."
